

The City Council opens the pedestrian access and road to El Confital

The City Council of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria has opened accesses both on foot and to the beach El Confital, after the municipal services of Roads and Works and City of Sea have completely removed the stones that collapsed from the hillside As a result of the water spurt last Saturday, April 29. The councilman of Ciudad de Mar, José Eduardo Ramírez, has confirmed that "security conditions have been restored".

During the week, the municipal workers had to remove the stones that fell - 6400 kg of stone of more than 10 centimeters - during the week. They proceeded to fix several socavones, to condition the road, extending artificial and refined garbage - 76 tons - and Their subsequent compaction.

The Roads and Works Service was also responsible for the emptying of the triple torsion mesh, from the pedestrian access (gateway) to the access of the beach where 13 tons of material were removed and the stones that remained loose on the slope were cleaned - 3 Tons of aggregates. The operators adjusted the wiring and the safety net that was in perfect condition to fulfill the function of stabilization of slope and to avoid detachments. Finally, 12 steel plates were soldered in pedestrian walkway of El Confital.

Ramírez added that the City Council and the management of the Gran Canaria Health Area, of the Government of the Canary Islands, continue to work on identifying the causes of this fecal contamination. "We do not rule out any of the hypotheses that can be discussed in this area, including the possibility that the pollution comes from the so-called Red House," said the mayor.

The red flag, therefore, will continue to wave in El Confital. In the morning of yesterday were collected new samples whose results will be known in the next days.
